Re: Approval for Invasive Removal at Elmwood Cemetery funded by Elmwood Cemetery Timber Sale Revenues

The City of Antigo has awarded the Elmwood Cemetery Timber Sale Bid to McFarland Cascade. There is a large overgrown stand of buckthorn in the timber stand that should be removed. McFarland has proposed removal of the buckthorn at a rate of \$25.00/hour (half the price of the other quoted removal rate) if removed in conjunction with the timber harvest within the proposed harvest area. They are estimating removal will take approximately 30 hours in this area.

I am recommending funding the removal with Timber Sale Revenues, so we can remove approximately 20 acres of buckthorn in conjunction with the timber harvest for approximately half the rate of other removal proposals.

I am also recommending that we remove the additional buckthorn while the contractor is mobilized in the location. The rate would be \$50.00/hour and the estimated total time is 20 hours. The hourly rate is comparable to the other invasive removal quotes, and it would be in our best interest to remove all the buckthorn at the same time.

Re: Approval to Construct Low Level Boardwalks Using Budgeted CIP Funds

We currently have \$11,709.00 to construct parking and paths. I am requesting permission to use budgeted funds to have posts placed, so our crews can construct low-level boardwalks, which will create access to our Northern Natural Area from the Springbrook Trail.

During certain times of the year the trail is not accessible due to wet conditions. The low level boardwalks will provide access for the x-country skiing connecting loop, the back 9 of the Disc Golf Course, and year-round hiking and biking. Placement of the posts is estimated at \$5,500.00 and materials for in-house construction will be the remainder. I am requesting permission to use the budgeted funds from CIP to place posts and have our staff construct low-level boardwalks, which will provide connections to hiking, biking, and x-country skiing trails as well as year-round access to the back 9 of the disc golf course. Continued expansion will occur as funds are available.

To move forward with the Al Remington Little League Seating Deck Project off of Langlade Road we need to have a set of engineered and stamped plans, so we can bid the project.

I have reached out to a number of engineer / architects, and design firms with the proposal. I received three quotes, and after conferring with Roger Musolff and Charley Brinkmeier we are recommending the low quote from Design Build by Visner for \$3,500.00. These funds are budgeted in CIP under ball diamond improvements.

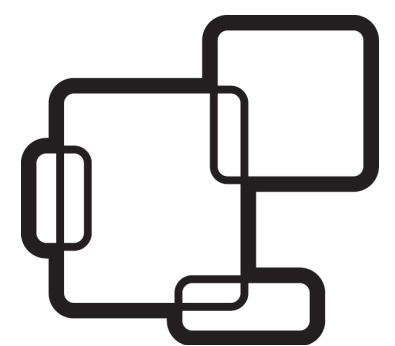
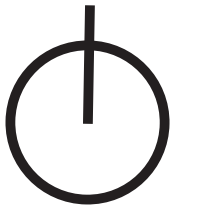
The plans should be completed end of February or early March, so we can bid the project, and hopefully break ground in 2019.

Re: Request to Keep Flag Football Registration Fees at \$10.00 for 2019

Dave Brandt donated \$6,000.00 in 2016, so the Flag Football registration fee would be \$10.00 for all participants (normally registration would be \$13.00 resident and \$26.00 non-resident).

We have \$10,000.00 budgeted in revenues for our 2019 registration/program fees for 2019.

We have not eliminated any programs and have generated approximately \$11,000.00 in revenues since 2016.

We have approximately \$694.00 remaining in the Brandt League donation, so I am recommending that we maintain a \$10.00 registration fee for 2019 and revert to the resident/non-resident fee schedule in 2020.

Based off of revenue projections from the last 3 years we will have enough to off-set the difference that will not be covered by Brandt League (approximately \$1,000.00).

Re: Park, Recreation and Cemetery Department General Updates

STAFFING: We interviewed 2 potential candidates for the year-round part-time position, and will hopefully fill the position in January. This position assists with night and weekend coverage as well as snow removal in the winter.

We will be advertising for our 3-4 summer seasonal positions in January, and reaching out to our past employees to see if they are interested in returning for the upcoming summer.

CEMETERIES: Winter or fall arrangements may be attached to the markers, or hung from a shepherd hook after October 1. Please don't hesitate to contact our office with questions (715.623.3633 ext-131/154).

SHELTERS & FACILITIES:

- **SHELTERS:** All shelters have been winterized except for the Peaceful Valley Warming House, which remains open year-round.
- **ICE RINKS, SLED HILL, X-COUNTRY SKIING:** Crews began preparations for the ice rink and hockey rink in Peaceful Valley. The hockey rink is open daily. We have scheduled our Open Skates in the Multi-Purpose Building in conjunction with AAYHA (there is a minimum of one open skate per month on no school days throughout the winter season. The November and December skates were well attended. The upcoming skates are scheduled for: 1/21, and 2/14.
- **SINGLE TRACK TRAIL:** Mike Heiny and Paul Wagner have completed the 2018 trail expansion that added an additional mile to the existing 2 miles of trail. We are very grateful for their efforts and to City Gas for allowing the use of their mini-dozer to create the trails. I will be working with Dave Falk and other park staff to create trail head signage and trail markings that note the different loops.

PROJECTS:

- **SLED HILL:** Antigo Rotary Club donated \$5,000.00 and their time to make improvements on the Sled Hill in Railway Activity Park. Final details will be completed by next summer (signage, benches, and additional landscaping).
- **CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS:** Crews decorated the beautiful tree placed in the Sign Park, and also hung garland from the Hudson Street Bridge, and various locations in our community. Various community groups, businesses, and organizations placed community Christmas Cards in Peaceful Valley Festival Grounds.
- **COMMUNITY SIGN:** Julie has contacted various service organizations within our community for placement on a new Community Sign that will recognize service organizations as well as youth accomplishments (Music & Arts, Athletics, and Clubs). We are hoping to have the sign completed and placed in the spring of 2019.

EVENTS:

- We are working with various groups and organizations to host their various community events within our parks and shelters. Check the Community Calendar, which can be found on the Antigo/Langlade County Community Resource Website: www.alcinfo.com. Upcoming events include Open Skates and Winter Fun & Family Wellness Day. Winter Wonderland Life-size holiday cards are in the Peaceful Valley Festival Grounds for holiday enjoyment.

VOLUNTEERS:

- Volunteers make our programs and events possible. Additionally, they also help us enhance and maintain our parks and trails.
- Thank you to all our coaches (baseball, soccer, flag football, and dance)
- Thank you to Mission Antigo Volunteers
- Thank you to Antigo Garden Club, which maintains planting areas and landscaping in our parks.
- Thank you to LAMBA members for expanding our trail system.

INVASIVES

- We will be working with Timberland Invasive Partnerships to remove invasive species along Springbrook Trail as well as the Single Track Trail.
- We are hoping to work with the Timber Sale contractor to remove buckthorn in the noted harvest area.

GRANTS AND BIDS

- We will be working to submit grants for funding to expand the existing trail system.
- We have received an extension for our 5 year comprehensive park plan, and will be finalizing an updated plan in 2019.
