My name is Alexander Mak, and I am the owner of 812-814 5th Ave in Antigo, Wisconsin.

I was informed on 1/25/23 that my building had a water pipe burst, which resulted in excessive water leakage. None of the water drained into the sewer system, all of it drained into the basement floor.

I live out of state and have only been able to visit Antigo once since the start of covid. The property was not vacant, I have been allowing the Antigo Visual Arts, a non profit organization the use of my building free of charge.

I would appreciate it if you can pass along my request to the water department and their board to reduce the water bill due to this unfortunate accident.

Jaime,

On 1/25/23 you notified me that you noticed a large volume consumption of units based upon the January 23rd meter reading. Water Department employee Chad Busse verified the potential water leak (as evidenced by moisture build-up of on the interior side of the 5th Avenue facing window on the building owned by Alex Mak) on 1/25/23. Chad proceeded to shut-off the water service to the building. I contacted Alex Mak and he arranged for the building to be opened by Rick who works on building maintenance; we (Rick, Kirk & myself) met on-site at 11:30 a.m.

Upon entering the east side of the basement we discovered a break in the copper line immediately downstream (+/- 2') of the meter. The foundation, walls and ceiling joists were all saturated with water but no evidence of standing water was found on the floor. Further investigation confirmed no floor drains existed and that the water dissipated through the sand floor located in the NW corner of this portion of the basement. No sanitary sewer charges are warranted in relation to this leak as the water loss was absorbed into natural ground below the foundation.

While on-site today, Rick indicated that he spoke with the person installing a new meter (May 2022) and recommended that the water for the building be shut-off for the coming winter. On our earlier phone conversation Rick indicated that he had called the Clerk's office (no specific date) and was told that he could not authorize the water shut-off to the building as this request need to be from the owner. During our on-site visit today Rick indicated that he communicated this information with the owner. Later when I called Alex Mak to let him know what we found during the site-visit, Alex indicated that the messaging was likely miscommunicated from their end. I informed Alex that we would calculate the costs for water use without the sanitary component (for consideration of forgiveness by Public Works Committee if needed) along with any discounts applicable to high-volume use.

There was also a smaller pipe, pass the meter leaking at a joint with the homeowner said, fed the hot water heater. Turned water off at street for the season and removed frozen broke meter and explained to homeowner this was billable. As Far as sprinkler credit, I promised nothing.

Will keep meter and MIU separate in case of dispute as this model meter is capable of data logging.

Re: Review Concrete Specifications & Inspection Requirements for the City's
Sidewalk/Driveway Maintenance Replacement Program - Information Only

Staff held an internal meeting on Tuesday, February 14, 2023 to discuss the items brought to Council's attention during the Public Hearing for the Annual Sidewalk and Driveway Approach Special Assessments for the maintenance of deteriorated locations. We will present a summary including the program goals, history, material utilized, contractor selection along with any suggested revisions based upon statements and inquiries.

Comments received, during the Public Hearing, were primarily towards the quality of the ready-mix materials supplied through County Concrete. It would not be fair to assume that unsatisfactory results could only come from material supply. With that in mind, staff reviewed the placement of ready-mix materials as well in our discussions to assure the best product available would reach the chosen locations.

As this agenda item is for "information only" purposes, we consider the suggestions made to serve as a guide to assuring an overall improved product in 2023. To do so, contractors, material suppliers and the City of Antigo must all commit to the success of the final product.

Bids were sought for the purchase of a Vacuum Trailer and Water Valve Turner for the Street Department. This will be utilized to turn and vacuum out the valves that we have in the streets along with hydrants. We currently have 1267 valves to exercise and 591 fire hydrants. We currently turn all these by hand. The purchase of this machine will save lots of wear and tear on employees and help with our valve turning program.

Three bids were received per the attached bid tab. It is my recommendation to purchase the vacuum trailer and water valve turner from MacQueen Equipment for \$71,210. This purchase is budgeted.

Re: Review Bids and Recommend Contractor Award from Project Designer Strand Associates for the Potable Water Supply Project at the Springbrook Wastewater Treatment Plant

Bids were electronically opened by our engineering consultant (Strand Associates) on Tuesday, February 14, 2023 at 2:00 p.m. with the City linked-in by virtual meeting software. Two bids were received with a recommendation of award to the low-bidder (August Winter & Sons, Inc. of Appleton, WI) in the amount of \$289,500. There was an alternate bid option #2 for an additional 2-year warranty for the well-pump extending from 3 to 5 years for an amount of \$4,900 but it is recommended to decline this choice.

The projected cost for construction and engineering for the project now stands at \$289,500 (construction) + \$41,700 (design & construction engineering fees) for a total of \$331,200. The 2023 budget for this work included a \$25,000 carry-over from 2022 from the digester upgrade account + \$325,000 for construction for a total budget of \$350,000. With your approval, at tonight's Public Works, meeting this project will proceed without the need to advance the matter to Council; completion will be from sufficient 2023 budgeted funds.

Bids for the above-referenced Project were opened on February 14, 2023. Two Bids were received with the resulting Bid tabulation enclosed. The low Bid of \$289,500 was less than ENGINEER's opinion of probable construction cost.

August Winter & Sons, Inc. of Appleton, Wisconsin, was the apparent low Bidder at \$289,500. The Bid included a Bid Bond for 5 percent and Addenda Nos. 1 and 2 were acknowledged. The Bid is deemed to be responsive.

Strand Associates, Inc.® has previously worked with August Winter and Sons, Inc. on projects for the Wolf Treatment Plant Commission, Fontana/Walworth Water Pollution Control Commission, the City of Fond du Lac, and numerous other projects. For those projects, the owners determined August Winter and Sons, Inc. to be responsible.

If you determine that August Winter and Sons, Inc. is a responsible Bidder after your evaluation of their qualifications, we recommend proceeding with award of the Contract in accordance with Article 18 of the Instructions to Bidders.

Re: Review Bids and Recommendation of Contractor award by Ayres Associates for Parking Lot Bids at Various Locations Including the West Parking Lot @ City Hall, Alley-way on north side of 5th Avenue (Clermont to Edison) and in the Municipal Lot between 5th & 6th Avenue (Former Superior Grinding Location)

Bids were electronically opened (by our engineering consultant Ayres Associates) on Tuesday, February 14, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. with the City linked-in by virtual meeting software. Three bids were received with a recommendation of award to the low-bidder (American Asphalt of Mosinee, WI) in the-amount-of \$382,366.90. There was an alternate bid option #1 for the replacement of the concrete driveway pad in front of the fire apparatus storage bay but it is recommended to decline this choice due to a lack of available funds (+/- \$50,000 shortfall).

The projected cost for construction and engineering for the City Hall project now stands at \$232,524 (\$245,058 CIP Budget OPI-9) & \$192,718 (\$171,100 CIP Budget EDI-13a). The 2023 budget shortfall, for the Downtown Parking Lot projects, is recommended to come from the CIP Undesignated Fund balance in an amount not-to-exceed \$25,000 to cover the difference in the actual versus budgeted amounts.

I recommend an award for the 2023 parking lot construction for various locations to American Asphalt in the-amount-of \$382,366.90 with funds being derived from existing sources listed including the authorization for the additional \$25,000 of Undesignated CIP Funds with the Committee recommendation being forwarded on to the March Council meeting.
