Discussion and Action May Occur on Any of the Following Agenda Items:

1. Approval to Patch the North Part of Sunset Drive South of Fifth Avenue

Aldersperson Darling commented that he has driven on this street and questioned why this street should be patched when other streets are in worse condition.

Aldersperson Bugni noted that he agrees with Aldersperson Darling, however, Sunset Drive is a heavily traveled street compared to other streets. There has not been any maintenance done on this road in the past two years. Something has to be done with the streets, either budget more money or find additional funding sources.

Aldersperson Darling noted that Marshfield recently had a referendum to add \$1 per \$1,000 to their taxes for road construction and it was defeated 2:1.

Mark Desotell indicated that no maintenance has been done on Sunset Drive for the past two years as this street was on the project list until recently. Typically the City would not spend money on a street that was going to be pulverized. This has now become an operating issue since the project has been pulled. Staff does a good job on prioritizing streets utilizing their pavement rating system.

Upon inquiry by Aldersperson Turney, Aldersperson Bugni noted that he requested this item for the past several years already.

Bob Piskula noted that this is not a pothole issue or a patch issue. What is being requested is a mill and overlay, an overlay, or a scratch and overlay. This would be labor intensive to do something with now. That is why it was placed on the five year plan. An overlay can be done, but typically the blacktop would be approximately two inches thick. This would have to be done by the County. When the City does an overlay, it is a temporary fix.

Upon inquiry by Aldersperson Feller Gottard, Mr. Desotell indicated that this project was in addition to the sidewalk and unfortunately because the sidewalk was not completed, the road construction funds needed to be returned to the state. Mr. Desotell will speak with staff and have the street placed in the maintenance program.

Motion to refer Sunset Drive maintenance to staff.

Re: Approve Irving St Paving Bid

Irving Street has had multiple utility excavations and has deteriorated to point where continued patching is not financially viable. After discussing Irving Street under any other matters and hearing no objections, we are proceeded with obtaining bids for paving about 500 feet of Irving Street (25' wide 3" thick.) The Street Department personnel is planning on removing the existing asphalt and sand base and replacing it with a 12" gravel base. Then we will have the winning asphalt bidder shape and pave that area. We are anticipating the bids for paving to be about \$20,000 - \$25,000. The bids will be opened on August 9, 2016 at 10:00 am and will be provided at the special meeting.
