CITY OF ANTIGO

AGRICULTURE LEASE

This agriculture Lease made and entered into this 14th day of July, 2024, by and between the City of Antigo, a municipal corporation, existing by and under the authority of the laws of the State of Wisconsin, hereafter referred to as City, and Wanca Custom Works, hereafter referred to as TENANT.

CITY here by does lease to TENANT the following described premises located in the City of Antigo, Wisconsin to wit:

Parcels: 201-2915.005 and 201-2942.040 (See attached maps.)

This lease shall be effective for the term of one (1) year beginning on the 1st day of June, 2024, and ending on the 30th day of April 2025, with the TENANT paying the sum of \$0 per acre in exchange for TENANT to work up the land to be utilized for solar fields.

This lease can be terminated with a thirty (30) day written notice to the TENANT. The CITY has proposed this land for Industrial Park use and is seeking to sell this property to any industrial prospect.

TENANT OBLIGATIONS

- a. TENANT shall farm the leased premises in a sound and “husband-like” manner.
- b. TENANT shall not cut or damage live trees without the CITY’S written consent.
- c. TENANT shall have a soil fertility test done by a reputable company and use the recommended fertilizer. A copy of this test must be made available to the CITY.
- d. TENANT shall not permit trash or rubbish to accumulate nor permit noxious weeds to seed on the premises.
- e. TENANT shall make repairs to fences and repairs to other improvements if damaged by TENANT.
- f. At the end of the lease term, TENANT shall deliver to CITY complete possession of the leased premises in as good repair and condition as they are at the time TENANT takes possession, excepting: ordinary wear, loss by fire, or unavoidable destruction.
- g. TENANT will not plant any crop, which shall not have a normal maturity within the term of this lease.
- h. None of the leased land shall be placed in soil bank or other government land retirement program without the written consent of the CITY.
- i. TENANT shall not burn any product without the prior written consent of the CITY.
- j. TENANT shall be strictly liable to the CITY from any damages resulting from the application or use by the TENANT or pesticides or agricultural chemicals and also for any other environmental contamination, liquid manure or hazards of any kind arising from the TENANT’S use and occupancy of the premises.
- k. TENANT, his agents and employees will not, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, discriminate or permit discrimination against any person or group of persons in any manner prohibited by Title IV of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and Part 21 of the Regulations of the Office of the Secretary of Transportation. TENANT further agrees to comply with any requirement made to enforce the foregoing which may be demanded of the CITY by the United States Government under authority of said Part 21.
- l. TENANT must submit a cropping plan and it shall be submitted annually to the Parks, Recreation & Cemeteries Supervisor prior to spring planting in March.
- m. TENANT shall not sublease this property without the express written permission of the CITY.

INSPECTION AND IMPROVEMENT

- a. CITY, its agents, employees, representatives and contractors shall have the right to make repairs and improvements to the leased premises at all times, including without limitation thereof, surveys, test borings, installation of drainage tile and ditches and underground and above ground utilities, after giving notification to TENANT.
- b. CITY, its agents, employees, representatives and contractors shall have the right to enter the leased premises at all times, after giving proper notification to TENANT.
- c. The rent shall be rebated as to any of the leased crop land rendered unproductive by CITY’S actions.
- d. City will give TENANT thirty (30) days notice before any and all construction is to begin on said leased property and reimburse the tenant for all tenants’ cost for planting and the crop value.

OTHER PROVISIONS

- a. TENANT shall hold and maintain a certificate of general liability insurance for activities conducted on the leased premises in the amount of \$1,000,000 and the TENANT shall name the CITY as an additional insure on said policy. The said certificate shall be on file with the City Clerk's Office.
- b. TENANT shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the CITY and its officers, officials, employees and volunteers from and against any and all liability, loss, damage, expense, costs (no limitations) of every nature arising out of TENANT'S use and occupancy of this premises in any fashion.

PENALTY PROVISIONS

- a. In the event that TENANT breaches or fails to fulfill any of the covenants and promises contained herein, TENANT shall forfeit the sum of \$100 per day until tenant ceases breach or failure.
- b. In the event that TENANT breaches or fails to fulfill any of the covenants and promises contained herein, this lease agreement may be terminated at any time at the discretion of the Antigo Common Council.

SENSIBILITY

- a. Any provision of this lease which is deemed to be invalid by any judicial body having authority, however, shall be considered severed or deleted here from. Such determination shall not serve to invalidate the remaining provisions of this lease.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO AGREEMENT

4th Ave/Field Street – City of Antigo
Amendment dated August 19, 2024

The Agreement for Professional Services made as of June 13, 2023, between City of Antigo (OWNER) and Ayres Associates Inc (CONSULTANT) is hereby amended as set forth below.

Scope of Services

This amendment is for Construction Staking, Shop Drawing Submittals and Storm Sewer design modifications based on required contractor investigation of existing storm system where no records or A/E investigation was possible.

Construction Staking

CONSULTANT proposes to perform construction staking for the City of Antigo 4th Avenue Watermain, Sanitary Sewer, Storm Sewer, Curb & Gutter and Curb Ramps.

- Stake approximately 30 feet of sanitary mainline and 2 connections along 4th Avenue.
- Stake approximately 310 feet of watermain and associated appurtenances (21 +/-) along 4th Avenue. Staking of mainline on 50' intervals, including offsets.
- Stake approximately 650 feet of storm sewer including manholes and catch basins. Staking of mainline on 50' intervals, including offsets.
- Stake approximately 615 lineal feet of curb and gutter at an offset as requested by contractor on 25' intervals, including PCs, PTs, and VPCs.
- Stake curb ramps and improvements for ADA compliance at intersection of 4th Avenue & USH 45,
- Confirm that a minimum of 2 horizontal and 2 vertical control points are in each area of construction.
- 4 mobilizations are anticipated for all staking.
- A minimum of 3 working days' notice is required for all staking requests.

Contract Administration

CONSULTANT shall provide contract administration services including the following: verification of bonding and insurance, preparation of Notice of Award and Notice to Proceed, attend and conduct the preconstruction meeting, and review of contractor's shop drawing submittals for sanitary, water and storm sewer.

Fee

We will perform the above services for an amount as stated below. The terms will be time and expense (T&E) based on a standard hourly rate for each class of employee, plus reimbursable expenses. The Reimbursable Expenses Schedule and Standard Hourly Rates Schedule are attached.

Estimate Fee not to exceed \$12,350 (T&E) without Owner Approval based on the estimated breakdown below.

An increase of \$7,250 (T&E) in compensation for Construction Staking
An increase of \$5,100 (T&E) in compensation for Construction Administration.

Re: Portable Safety Barrier Purchase with Funding Coming From \$5,000 CVMIC Safety Grant and Remaining Balance From Undesignated Capital Improvement Fund

We have identified a safety issue with crowd control specific to our parades in the downtown area, where the pedestrians are crowding the parade vehicles and floats creating a safety hazard.

I am proposing a solution of purchasing 235 portable safety barriers that would create a continuous barrier along the parade route, specifically on 5th Avenue from Superior Street to Edison Street. The barriers would be yellow in color, 8'6" long each and interlock with each other to create the continuous barrier on the north and south side of 5th Avenue.

The street department has been involved in the conversation about the barriers and is willing to place the barriers when needed. The street department is looking into the purchase of a trailer for hauling the barriers.

I envision the barriers would be useful in other events throughout the city, such as our K9 demonstrations to create a safe area.

The cost of the barricades is quoted at \$85.50 each, with a total cost for 235 barriers at \$20,092.50 + \$997.00 shipping for a total cost of \$21,089.50.

The funding would come through a \$5,000 CVMIC safety grant with the remaining balance of \$16,089.50 coming from the undesignated capital improvement fund.

I am requesting approval to purchase 235 safety barriers for a total cost of \$21,089.50.

Subject: Review of Traffic Enforcement on 5th Avenue

Historical Background

There has been discussion at several city meetings pertaining to visibility at certain intersections and speed along the 5th Avenue corridor. Police Chief, Dan Duly, has provided a report containing information from 2023 as well as 2024 citing the speed warnings and violations, along with stop sign and traffic signal warnings and violations. He also provided more detailed information for the 5th Avenue intersections at 5th and Edison, 5th and Dorr, 5th and Lincoln and 5th and Clermont. See attached report.

Current Circumstance

The report indicates multiple warnings and citations being issued during 2023 and 2024 to date. Warnings include both written and verbal for various traffic offenses. The report shows there have been six (6) speed violations along the 5th Avenue corridor between November 30, 2023, and May 17, 2024, (approximately 5 ½ months) resulting in a warning or citation. The report also indicates that there have been at least six (6) crashes along 5th Avenue, in approximately a thirteen (13) month period, from April 27, 2023, to June 3, 2024.
