1. Review Bids with Recommendation of Award by Ruekert & Mielke for Water Tower Replacement, SCADA System & Clear Well Repairs at the Water Treatment Plant

Mark Desotell, Director of Administrative Services submitted a memo to review bids with a recommendation of award by Ruekert & Mielke for the water tower replacement, Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system and clear well repairs at the Water Treatment Plant.

Mr. Desotell, Director of Administrative Services, explained this will be a new 200,000 gallon water tower located at the water treatment plant. Three bids were received ranging from \$2.913 million to \$3.25 million. Low bid was Maguire Iron, Inc. out of Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Contractors from five different states will be involved in the project with a number of them being from Wisconsin.

Ruekert & Mielke did review the proposals and recommended the proposal from Maguire Iron, Inc.

Mr. Desotell explained \$1.5 million in principal forgiveness has already been received. American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds will be considered and the plant replacement fund for the balance.

Construction will take place in 2023. Demolition of the existing tower will likely take place in 2024.

A resolution approving the Maguire bid will be forwarded to Council tonight for approval.

Motion to approve the bid from Maguire Iron, Inc. in the amount of \$2,913,100 for the water tower replacement, Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system and clear well repairs at the Water Treatment Plant.
