He would like to make an offer as it would be used for Remington Oil, Yamaha, and another business is interested in going in too. Resolution No. 111-21: Increase 2022 Ambulance Base Rates by 5.5% to Include the Base Rates, Interfacility Base Rates and Mileage

WHEREAS, in order for the City of Antigo Fire Department to stay current with ambulance rates for the communities it serves an increase to the base rates, interfacility base rates and mileage are needed; and,

WHEREAS, the Resident and Non-Resident, Interfacility and Mileage Rates will increase 5.5% to follow the industry standard as noted in the chart below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE COMMON COUNCIL, City of Antigo, to approve a 5.5% increase in Resident and Non Resident base rates, interfacility base rates and mileage for the ambulance service effective January 1, 2022.

Resolution No. 112-21: Adoption of Permit Application Forms for the Use of Sidewalk Cafes/Business Displays and Alcohol License Premises Extensions within City Right Of Way along the Downtown Corridor

WHEREAS, with the completion of the Downtown Fifth Avenue roadway corridor reconstruction projects; and,

WHEREAS, the elimination of two through lanes in each direction allowed for both the addition of asymmetric diagonal parking and a widened sidewalk/terrace space; and,

WHEREAS, the Downtown Antigo First Group along with interested business owners advocated for the limited use of sidewalk space along the front of their building facades for sidewalk cafes, business displays and for the consideration of alcohol license premises extensions; and,

WHEREAS, the City in conjunction with American with Disability Act (ADA) guidelines and recommendations require that a minimum of 36" of unencumbered open and accessible sidewalk be maintained at all times for pedestrian traffic safety; and,

WHEREAS, an annual permit form(s) are to coincide with the renewal dates of the existing alcohol licensing permits as administered through the Clerk-Treasurer/Finance Director's office; and,

WHEREAS, the annual application fees for the Sidewalk Café /Business Display or the Alcohol License Premises Extension permits are established at \$10 per year; and,

WHEREAS, the permits will be administered by the Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator and the Clerk-Treasurer/Finance Director respectively.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE COMMON COUNCIL, City of Antigo, to adopt both a Sidewalk Café/Business Display and Alcohol License Premises Extension permit application process including the recommended permit application forms.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, BY THE COMMON COUNCIL, City of Antigo, to allow staff to provide incidental updates to the application forms as necessary, to protect the best interests of the City, with any significant alterations or revisions as requested by staff, the Antigo First group or business owners requiring additional Committee/Council action accordingly.

Resolution No. 113-21: Allow Clerk-Treasurer/Finance Director the Ability to Waive Event Permit Fees and Insurance Requirements for Listed Previously Held Events for 2022

WHEREAS, the Parks, Recreation, and Cemetery Director has requested that the Clerk-Treasurer/Finance Director be allowed to waive event permit fees and insurance requirements for previously held events using the following criteria:

- The organization or group is not creating a profit from the event. If funds are raised during the event they are invested back into the community and used for various community projects, events, programs or local organizations.

He noted concern that it is being stated that the City is not funding/supporting the Library but the City is supporting them.

Aldersperson Bauknecht agreed it is an unfair assessment of the City by the Antigo Daily Journal and the Antigo Public Library.

Mr. Desotell and Mayor Brandt reported they attended the next Library Board meeting following the Antigo Daily Journal article and addressed the Board about the misrepresentation.

Aldersperson Bugni noted people need to receive both sides of the story. He also noted that he would like to see the Library hours restored.

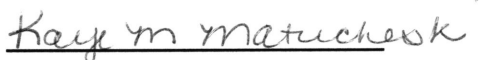
