Finance, Personnel & Legislative Committee of the City of Antigo met in Regular Session on the above date at 5:45 PM in the Council Chambers, City Hall, Thomas C. Bauknecht presiding.

Discussion and Action May Occur on Any of the Following Agenda Items

1. Review and Recommendation for Gasoline and Fuel Bids for the City of Antigo for 2026, 2027, 2028

Mayor Bauknecht noted there were two bids for gasoline and fuel for the City for 2026, 2027, 2028 with a recommendation.

Alderperson Bugni stated he looked at the bid information provided, noting Wagner Shell was the higher bid, but they are local and they do contribute a lot to the community. He noted that Kwik Trip is a good company but feels the City should stay local. Alderperson Dieck agreed with Alderperson Bugni about staying local.

Sarah Repp, Park, Cemetery and Recreation Director, noted that one of the positives about Kwik Trip is with 900 locations in the state, when staff needs to go to trainings and on transports out of town, the City will still receive a discount on fuel.

Ms. Repp noted when staff looked at the two bids, the billing was similar and noted there was a difference with blended fuel. She noted Kirk Packard, Street Commissioner, spoke with Kwik Trip and he is not aware of any issues with their blending.

Alderperson Bugni stated based upon what Wagner Oil does for the community, he feels the City should support them.

Alderperson Kassis questioned if it was normal for the City to seek a three-year bid. Ms. Repp stated the City had previously put the bids out for two years, however she wanted to get the fuel bid on a three-year schedule.

Upon inquiry from Alderperson Kassis, Ms. Repp noted that Wagner Shell blends diesel fuel at a higher ratio and noted that Mr. Packard did speak with Kwik Trip about their diesel blend and he did not have any concerns.

Alderperson Kassis agrees with Alderperson Bugni but it is difficult to go local with such a difference in price and opportunities. He questioned what the recommendation was based on. Ms. Repp stated based on price, two locations and availability of discount at any store in the state.

There was a discussion about the number of locations owned by Wagner Shell. Alderperson Bugni restated he is concerned about price however, he feels because Wagner Shell does support the City he is voting for Wagner Shell.

Mayor Bauknecht discussed cost savings by accepting the most advantageous bid. Alderperson Hayes questioned if the in-store discount offered by Kwik Trip would be utilized and Ms. Repp and Corey Smith, Fire Chief, shared that in cases of trainings or fire emergencies where food and beverages need to be provided, the discount would be very helpful.

Kaye Matucheski, Clerk-Treasurer/Finance Director, stated just because they are local is not a good enough reason to take a high bid, it has to meet the requirement of being most advantageous to the City. Alderperson Bugni stated the contributions they provide to the community helps Wagner Shell meet that requirement.
