2. Swearing in and Badge Pinning of Firefighter/EMT Sam Vanden Langenberg

Corey Smith, Fire Chief, noted that Sam Vanden Langenberg was hired in August of 2024 and previous to joining the City of Antigo he was a member of the Fox Crossing Fire Department as well as serving with the United States Marine Corps Reserve. He completed Fire and EMS training at Fox Valley Technical College in Appleton and is currently enrolled in the paramedic class at Northcentral Technical College. Chief Smith congratulated Mr. Vanden Langenberg on the completion of his probationary period and wished him continued luck with his paramedic class.

Kaye Matucheski, Clerk-Treasurer/Finance Director, administered the oath of office to Firefighter/EMT Sam Vanden Langenberg with his wife Laura Vanden Langenberg pinning on his badge.

3. **Subjects on the Current Agenda**

Christine Breutzmann, 535 Elm Street, questioned the timeline of when the City would be live-streaming their meetings and getting Common Council meeting minutes available to the public in a timely manner.

Ms. Matucheski noted that the City is looking at the cost of live-streaming options. Ms. Breutzmann suggested the City could record meetings then post them on their website if live-streaming is too costly.

Ms. Matucheski stated that the Common Council minutes are available to the public after they have been approved by Council, and Alderperson Hayes suggested calling City Hall if Ms. Breutzmann needed help locating minutes.

Ms. Breutzmann stated Ms. Matucheski is always great at answering questions. She noted that she attended the Park, Cemetery and Recreation Commission meeting and stated she appreciated being heard and that Sarah Repp, Parks, Recreation, and Cemetery Director, is putting together another meeting.

Ms. Breutzmann questioned if the check for Baker Barns was for the Park, Cemetery and Recreation project from the last meeting and Ms. Repp stated it was not, noting it was for a different project.

**Committee Reports**

Alderperson Bugni stated the Weather Warning Siren Committee met on January 19, 2026 at 4:30 p.m. He noted the committee heard a presentation from Federal Signal and that Federal Signal has mechanical sirens. He noted the power needed for the sirens is about the same as a streetlight. He stated Federal Signal quoted \$138,000 for three sirens and noted that the cost for sirens for the City would be between \$138,000-\$150,000.

Alderperson Bugni stated donation funds are at \$5,000 maximum and they are applying for two local grant applications. He noted they are looking at a fundraiser at NorthStar Bowling Alley Alderperson Bugni stated the goal was to put up the sirens by spring, and he noted that goal will not be met. He also stated if the committee is not able to raise the funds they will have to fold the project.

Alderperson Bugni noted he and Alderperson Wagner and committee member Jeff Gieger were on the local morning radio show. He stated that News Channel 7 also ran a story about the committee seeking funds for weather warning sirens.

He stated the next meeting will be Monday February 23, 2026 at 4:30 p.m.

**Consent Agenda Resolutions**

**Resolution No. 8-26 Nexgen 911 Addressing Grant through Langlade County**

Whereas, Langlade County Dispatch will be purchasing a new 911 software, Next Generation 911(NG911) with the anticipated costs to acquire required infrastructure and remediate, gather and/or create the required NG911 data layers to meet the NG911 i3

standard within Langlade County is estimated at \$320,012.12 ; and,

Whereas, the City of Antigo has been made aware of errors in addressing; and,

Whereas, Langlade County Land Records has been made aware of an Office of Emergency Communications (OEC) Grant to help offset the cost of correcting addressing errors within the City; and,

Whereas, it was estimated to complete addressing corrections within the City, to be \$40,000 - \$60,000; and,

Whereas, the OEC Grant would cover 95% of the cost requiring the City to pay for \$2,000 - \$3,000 of the remaining cost.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the Common Council, City of Antigo, to request Langlade County Land Records apply for the OEC Grant to help correct addressing issues within the City.

Be It Further Resolved, the City will be financially responsible for \$2,000 - \$3,000 of the remaining matching funds with the funds to be derived from the Geographic Information System account within the general operating budget.

**Resolution No. 9-26 Wastewater Treatment Plant Full Facilities Review**

Whereas, the City has been informed of the need for a full facility review of the Wastewater Treatment Plant; and,

Whereas, a request for proposals were taken from consultants and reviewed by a panel; and,

Whereas, the panel has recommended entering into a contract with Strand & Associates for the cost not to exceed \$98,000.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the Common Council, City of Antigo, would like to enter into a contract with Strand & Associates to complete a full facility review of the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Be It Further Resolved, the City will be financially responsible for the cost of \$98,000 with the funds to be derived from the Wastewater Treatment Plant full facility review account.

**Resolution No. 10-26 Gasoline and Fuel Bids for 2026, 2027 and 2028 (Contingent Upon Approval by the Finance, Personnel, and Legislative Committee at a Meeting held on February 11, 2026)**

Whereas, the City of Antigo accepted Gasoline and Diesel Fuel bids for 2026, 2027, and 2028; and,

Whereas, the City of Antigo accepted Gasoline and Diesel Fuel bids for 2026, 2027, and 2028; and,

Whereas, Wagner Shell will provide a discount price off fuel for a total of \$0.14 with \$0.06 off all products in store, discount car washes, and provide Marty's Shell as a supplier in case of a shut down; and,

Whereas, Kwik Trip will provide a discount price off fuel for a total of \$0.18 with 10% off all products in store, discount car washes, and provide 900 other stores in case of a shut down.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, By The Common Council, City of Antigo, to award the bid to Wagner Shell \$0.14 with \$0.06 off all products in store, discount car washes, and provide Marty's Shell as a supplier in case of a shut down for 2026, 2027, 2028.

Mayor Bauknecht noted the Finance Personnel and Legislative Committee approved awarding the bid to Wagner Shell.

Aldersperson Wagner requested to abstain from voting on this matter. Aldersperson Henricks moved, Aldersperson Edwards seconded, for Aldersperson Wagner to abstain. All ayes, carried.

Upon inquiry from Aldersperson Rebstock, Ms. Repp noted Kwik Trip came in with a \$.18 discount with 10% off in-store products and up to 45% off car washes with two locations in the City as well as 900 locations statewide that will qualify for their discount. She noted Wagner Shell came in with a \$.14 discount with \$.06 off products in stores with Marty's Shell as their back-up if there is an emergency such as power loss.

Aldersperson Bugni noted voting for a higher bid is justifiable due to Wagner Oil Corporate being a local corporation and does a lot for the community. He feels it's a solid investment in local businesses.

Aldersperson Edwards questioned if Kwik Trip being open 24 hours makes a significant difference for City staff to complete their jobs.

Aldersperson Hayes questioned if this was fuel for all City vehicles and what the ballpark figure is on what is spent. Ms. Repp noted that the City uses approximately 54,000 gallons per year.

Aldersperson Bugni noted he would like the timeframe to be two years. Ms. Matucheski stated the bid was for three years so if Aldersperson Bugni would like it to be two years, it will have to go back to the bidding process.
