2. Approving Strict Use of Bio-degradable Bags for Residential Curbside Brush and Mulch Pick-up

Kirk Packard explained that the information regarding the use of bio-degradable bags by the public would be put in the paper, on Facebook, and on the radio. He stated there would also be mailings included in the water bill. Mr. Packard stated that the use of bio-degradable bags would not be mandated until spring of 2027.

Aldersperson Dieck asked where the bags were available. Mr. Packard stated the bags were available at Volm Bag, Menards, Ace Hardware, Walmart & Fleet Farm. He also stated the price of the bio-degradable bags would be comparable to plastic bags. Aldersperson Edwards asked how to tell if the bags were bio-degradable. Mr. Packard explained they would have a green circle on them.

3. Approval of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation State Municipal Agreement for US Hwy 45 Resurfacing

Charley Brinkmeier stated that the Wisconsin Department of Transportation approached the City wanting to resurface Hwy 45 from Spring Brook Bridge to Rusch Road with no utility work and minimal curb work. He also stated the resurfacing was being pushed ahead of some other projects, hoping to start construction in 2029.

Mr. Brinkmeier went on to say that the Wisconsin Department of Transportation would be asking for approximately \$62,000 in engineering from the City. He noted there were funds available from the TIF payback funds. He also stated that the remainder of the construction and engineering cost would be covered at the expense of the Department of Transportation.

Mr. Packard recommended going with the bid and noted that the City could decide whether to continue with every year or go to every other year after seeing what the trash impact was for this year.

Any Other Matters Authorized by Law to be Considered


Kirk Packard brought up the discussion of other streets the city planned to address this year with a Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating (PASER) 1-3, 1 being the worst. He stated one of the streets would be Pine Street from 4th to 3rd Avenue, with a PASER of 1-3. He also stated there were four lead services in that block that needed to be removed. Mr. Packard noted that there were a couple of residents that have bad sewer lines also, so they would have the opportunity to fix them at that time. He stated that the City has a couple of small spots in the main that need to be fixed, and he also noted getting all new blacktop and curb and gutter due to an overlay.

Aldersperson Dieck noted he would like the items discussed by Mr. Packard to be noticed on the next agenda so the public would have an opportunity to bring any concerns forward if they chose. Mr. Packard stated he would get the items on the agenda for the March Public Works Committee meeting.
